



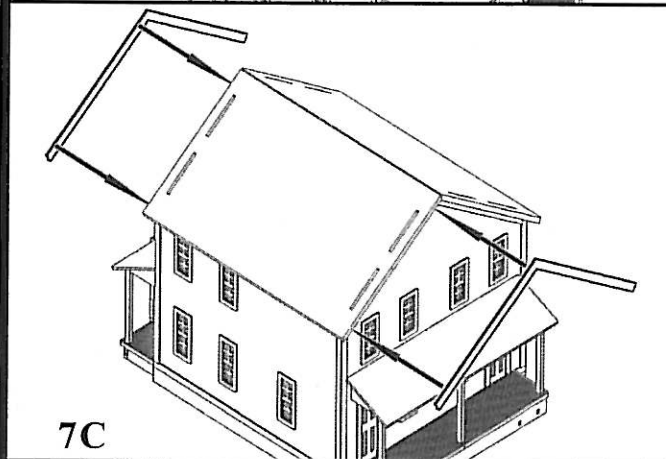

7B) Glue the two sub main roof panels using the slots to locate them to the tabs on the front and rear wall panels. Make sure that the scribed side faces downward.

7C) Now add the roof trim pieces by removing the backing from them and pressing them onto the ends of the sub roof panels

Steps:

8) Install the four sets of porch steps by first gluing the pairs of stringers into the slots in the porch support walls. Once these are in place you can add the step treads by removing the backing and pressing them into place on top of the stringers.

Paper roofing:

9) Apply the roofing shingles using white glue. Start at the bottom of each roof edge, gluing each strip of roof paper overlapping the previous row as you go up and staggering the joints between shingles as shown. You will need to cover the main roof and the front and rear porch roofs.

The completed shingles can then be painted and weathered as desired. We like to use a slate gray paint and dry brush lighter shades of color to pick up the highlights.

Chimneys:

10) The resin chimney can be located wherever you think it looks best. Although the chimney does have an angled base you may need to sand the base a bit to get it to accurately match the angle of the roof. Paint the chimney, then glue into place using contact cement or ACC.

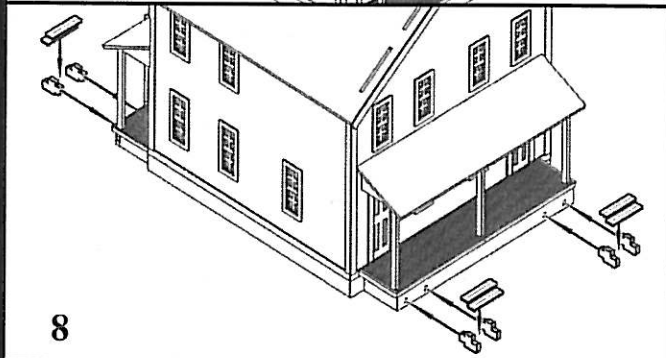

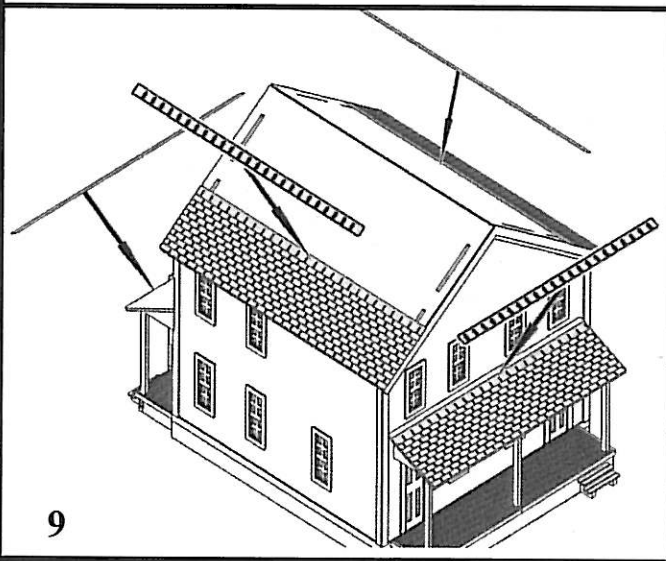

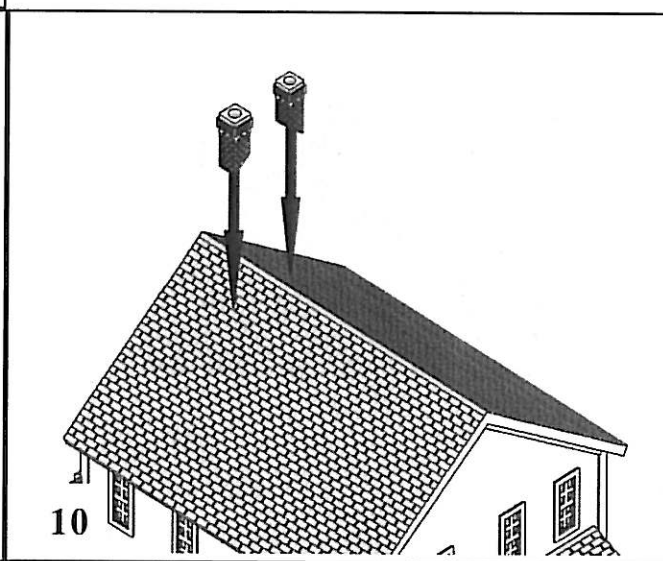
