



Once in place, you can paint the stonework with a gray or brown paint. Spend a few minutes and pick out some of the individual stones with lighter and darker shades of your base color. Once this is dry follow with a wash of light gray or black to represent the mortar between the stones (Light gray will make the foundation appear newer, black older). Finally dry brush some light gray or tan highlights.

Trim:

4) The corner trim is made up from two boards, one slightly wider than the other. Start by removing the backing from the thinner board and applying it flush with the edge of the wall. Now apply the remaining trim boards so that they overlap the edges of the narrow boards giving an even corner. Note that the corner boards are cut to match the roof line. Test fit each before removing the backing to make sure that it is correct.

Subroofing and trim:

5A) Starting with the back panel, glue the two sub roof panels onto the tabs on the main walls. Note that the front panel should overlap the rear panel at the peak.

5B) Now add the roof end trim pieces by removing the backing from them and pressing them onto the ends of the sub roof panels as shown.

Dormers:

(NOTE: This kit can be built without the top roof dormer windows. If you wish to leave them off, you can skip ahead to step 7.)

6A) Glue the three sides together for each dormer as shown, then glue the completed dormer into the slots in the front sub roof panel.

6B) Assemble the two dormer windows and press them into the openings.
