



Constructing the shell:

1) Start your kit by assembling the main house walls. Take the front wall assembly and glue each side wall section into place, then glue the rear wall into place. Check that all of the corners are square and set aside to dry. Once dry, you may wish to paint the base structure before continuing to the next step.

Windows & Doors:

2A) The parts for these are located on the trim sheet and the clear glazing sheet. First, remove the peel-and-stick from the lower sash and apply a section of clear window glazing. Repeat with the upper sash and frame it ensuring that the edge of the glazing is flush with the top edge of the window. Now stick the lower sash into place on the frame (for a little interest and variety it is possible to position the lower sash in an open position). Now take the window frame and remove the peel-and-stick from it. Center the window sash assembly into the frame and press into place. It is best to place the various window assemblies into their openings as they are done. Refer to diagram 2B for placement. The peel-and-stick adhesive on the frame will be more than enough to hold them into place.

Locate the inner and outer door panels, the glazing clear window and door frame piece for each door. Remove the peel-and-stick from the inner door panel and apply the window glazing to the back of it. Then attach the outer door panel to the inner panel. The door is then applied to the inside of the front wall and the peel-and-stick door trim is applied to the outer portion of the house and will hold the door into place.

Porch supports:

3) Locate the 3 pieces for the porch supports from your parts sheets. These assemble as shown in the diagram.

Foundation:

4) Peel-and-stick plastic stone sheets are provided to represent the foundation. Remove each section from the sheet and apply them to the bottom edge of the wall siding. Apply to the side walls first, then do the end walls. These pieces should be flush with the bottom and the sides of both the walls. Note that two of the foundation strips have square holes in them. These holes should be aligned with corresponding holes in the house making sure that the foundation does not obstruct the holes. Now apply the sections that go around the front porch.
