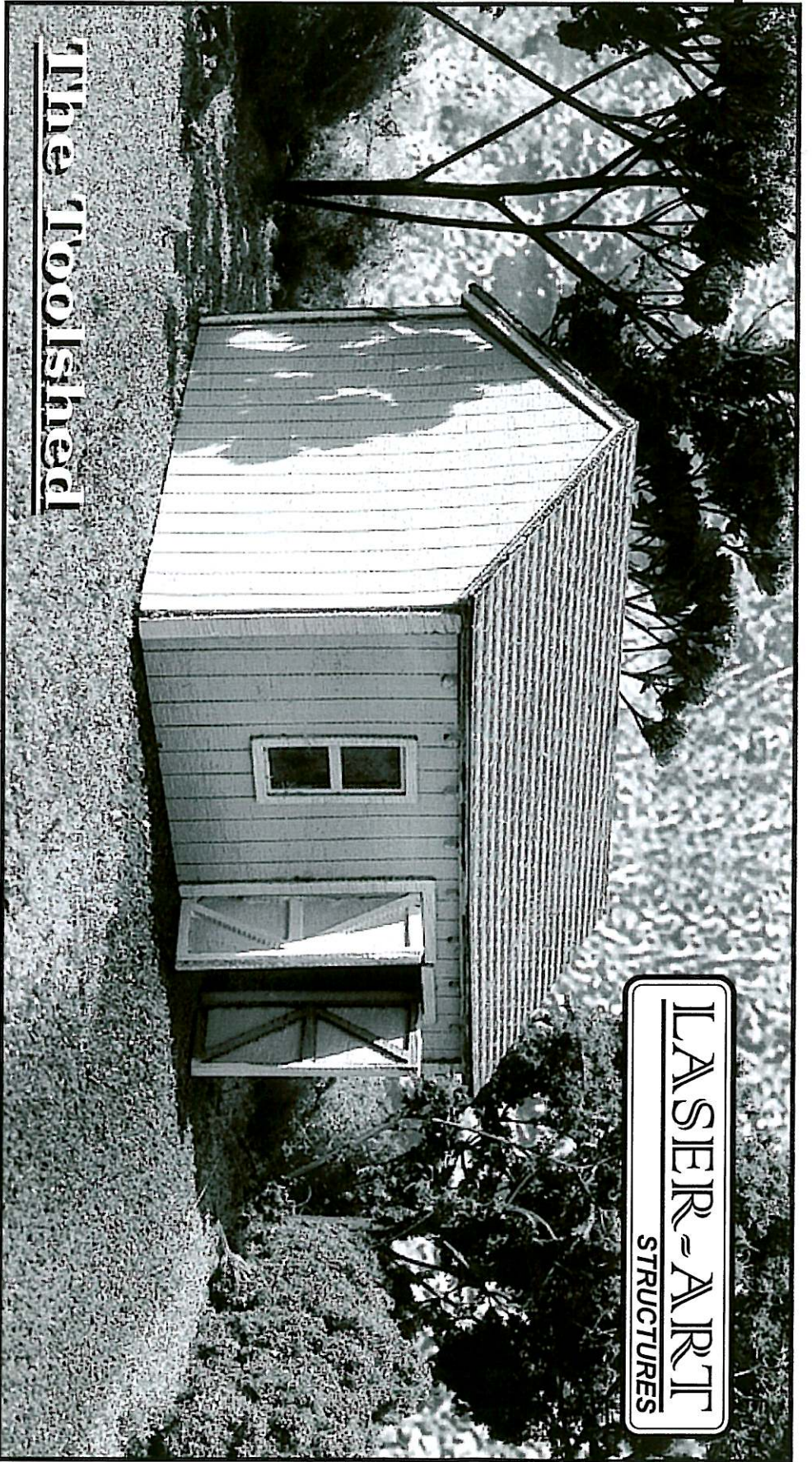

The Foolshed

No fine property is complete without a garden shed to keep garden tools, flower pots and all sorts of other stuff in. This classic shed design would be right at home in any yard from 1900 to the present. Build it with the doors open to show off all the clutter (not included), or close the door so the neighbors don't see the mess!

Assembly notes:

Only a couple simple tools are required to assemble this kit: a sharp X-Acto knife and tweezers to help hold the small parts. You will also need Elmer's white glue or similar for wood joints and liquid plastic cement (Tenax, Testor's or similar) for the roof trim. A small square may also be useful.

Take a few moments and read through the instructions and familiarize yourself with the parts sheets. As you go along refer back to the diagrams often to check part locations.

To simplify assembly we use a peel and stick adhesive on many of the trim items. Apply the various peel and stick parts by first removing the backing paper then gently setting the part into position. Once you are happy with the locations you can press the part into place to secure it. The glue remains flexible for about twenty-four hours after which it forms a hard joint.

We find it easier to paint the building shell and the trim pieces before final assembly. If you are using water-based paints be sure to paint both sides of the wall sections
