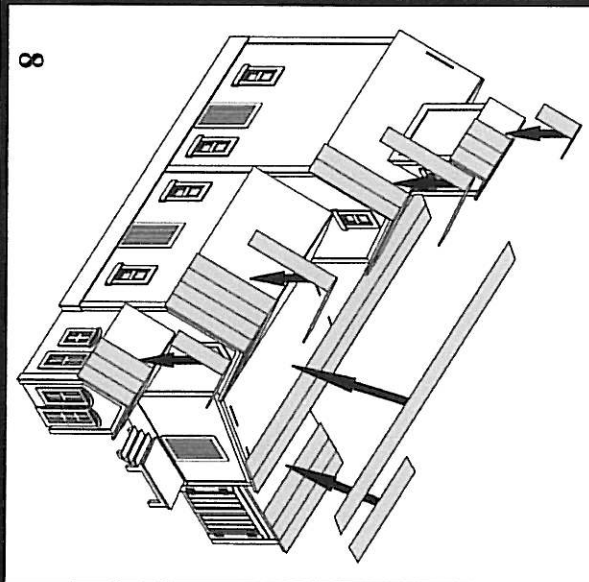


Loading deck:
 7) An optional loading dock has been provided. This can be used under one of the loading dock doors. Glue the two stair runners to the underside of the dock platform, then glue the assembly to the side of the structure as shown. Now remove the backing from each stair tread and press them onto the runners.

Roofing paper:
 8) The tar paper roofing can be glued into place with white glue. Overlap each strip slightly as you work your way across each roof. On our sample, we ran most of the paper sections vertical on the roof peaks and horizontally on the side shed and structure extension. make each section of roofing slightly long, then trim the paper flush with the roof edges once the glue is dry. Cut a couple narrower strips and fold these over the roof peaks to represent the roof caps.

Once installed the tar paper can be painted a weathered gray or even red or green. For a little added detail apply a thin strip of black along each seam with a fine brush or Sharpie marker to represent the tar sealant. Don't forget to seal around the base of the dormer and where the roof butts up against a wall.



Chimney:
 9) You can either glue the chimney directly to the roof by sanding the base to the proper angle has been sanded into it or you can cut a small hole into the roof and place your chimney down through it.
